Health and business double degrees at Australian Catholic University, Melbourne.

Students are able to combine a Bachelor of Business Administration with degrees in Applied Public Health, Nursing, Exercise Science, Biomedical Science, or Nutrition Science. Benefits of including a Bachelor of Business Administration with a health science discipline include:

- You graduate with two degrees for only one extra year of study
- As a graduate you will gain skills that could help you run own business or manage clinics, gyms, hospitals, or government departments
- You are qualified to work in a business-related capacity within health science organisations, such as pharmaceutical firms
