

- **Citizen science:** Would you like to help save wetland birds and their precious environments? By simply collecting feathers from wetland areas you can help create the first ever Feather Map of Australia - a citizen science project to help researchers ensure the survival of waterbirds
- **The blood of dragons:** With an evolutionary development dating back 40 million years, armoured scales, a lethal bite and weighing in at an average of 80kg, the Komodo dragon is a very impressive reptile. Even more impressive, this dragon's blood could hold the key to fighting multi-drug resistant bacteria that cause serious diseases

- Cloud and Enterprise Computing - mainframe and cloud computing
- Games Development - design, creation and production of computer and video games
- Mobile App Development - with a particular focus on developing apps for mobile platforms
- Networking and Security - join the war in cyberspace through ethical hacking and data security
- Software Development - testing, refinement and maintenance of tools and techniques, evaluation of existing products.


- Explore mock construction sites
