* Composite Levies – This fee includes costs for the College Newsletter, Combination Lock (Yr 7), ID card, Sick Bay, annual Chronicle, SRC fees, Special events, Library and Audio-Visual fees, Shuttle and camp buses, stationary / materials of all learning areas, Class sets, photocopying of subject materials and exams, compulsory subject excursions, outdoor education camps, Directions 9 Programme, Lifeskills Program, Seminar Days, Year 12 Retreats.

Capital Fee – This fee assists in maintaining student printing, downloads and ICT infrastructure. This includes a notebook levy approved by the Board of Management in 2013 to partly cover the cost of notebook given in Year 7 and Year 10, so that students can keep their assigned notebooks at the end of three years.

Additional charges may be as follows:

FEE DEPOSIT FOR NEW STUDENTS

A deposit of \$500 is to be paid upon acceptance of an enrolment place for incoming students. This normally is due in May of the enrolment year. This deposit will be deducted from the total fees payable for the succeeding year.

FAMILY DISCOUNTS

Discounts on tuition fees only, are available for those families with more than one student attending either Caroline Chisholm Catholic College or Marian College. Discounts are as follows:

- 2 students – 10%
- 3 students – 20%
- 4 students – 40%

PAYMENT OF FEES & CHARGES

School fees should be paid in four instalments during the school year:

First Instalment	12 October 2017
Second Instalment	15 March 2018
Third Instalment	17 May 2018
Fourth Instalment	19 July 2018

SCHOOL FEES PAYMENT PLAN

Families who prefer to pay in smaller instalments **weekly, fortnightly or monthly** are encouraged to use the Direct Debit system. Direct Debit forms are available from the Accounts Office. Fee payments by BPAY, EFTPOS or by credit card (*MasterCard, VISA or Bankcard*) are accepted.

Families who received **Centrelink Family Payments** may choose to pay school fees as fortnightly deductions from their **Centrelink payment**. Forms are available from the Accounts Office.

SCHOOL BUILDING FUND

Each family is requested to contribute to the School Building Fund. This is a voluntary contribution and is tax deductible. For **2018** school year we suggest the amount of **\$3,000**. This fund is used for capital expenditures: building improvements and refurbishment and capital acquisitions. Donations of **\$5,000** or more will be acknowledged in an Honour Board.

VOLUNTARY COSTS

The College provides a variety of non-compulsory co-curricula activities and social events. Additional costs will be incurred for these activities should parents chose to allow their child to participate. SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic Scholarships are offered to Year 7 students enrolling at the College, covering tuition fees for 2 years: Year 7 and Year 8. Academic scholarships are also offered to Year 9 students covering tuition fees for Year 9 and Year 10, and likewise to Year 11 students covering tuition fees for Years 11 and 12. Students who wish to apply for a scholarship place must sit an exam that is administered and evaluated by an external body.
